10 positions available for 2020-2021

20 hours per week

August 17, 2020 to June 11, 2021

Monday-Friday 8:30 am to 5 pm

Closed Saturdays, Sundays and University holidays

CAPS operates on a shift schedule

AM shift – 8:30 am-12:30 pm

PM shift – 1 pm - 5 pm

Wednesday AM shift (8:30-12:30) is mandatory training shift which includes Group Supervision and Training Seminar

20 hours per week = 5 shifts

- 10 individual client hours per week

- 1 hour individual supervision (with Licensed Psychologist)

- 2 hours group supervision (8 trainees max per group)

- 1 hour training supervision (Wednesday mornings)

- 1 hour crisis coverage

- 1 hour outreach

- 4 hours paperwork

No psychological testing available

Clinical Population

Clients are made up of University of La Verne students representing a diverse population.

We follow the university calendar and are busiest October-November and March-May.

Typical diagnoses:

Depression, Anxiety, Adjustment Disorder, Substance Use, Eating Disorders

Training opportunities:

Individual brief therapy, crisis intervention, outreach to university community on relevant mental health issues

Theoretical Orientations and treatment modalities:

Risk assessment and crisis intervention, individual therapy, psychodynamic, CBT, existential, person-centered, brief-solution focused

Multidisciplinary team:

CAPS staff consists of:

- Director
- Associate Director of Training
- Staff Psychologist
- Post Doctoral Fellows
- MFT and PsyD trainees

We often work with Housing and Residential Life Staff, Accessibility Services, Health Center, Athletics, and other Student Affairs Staff.

Trainee Evaluation

Trainees will be evaluated at the end of the Fall and Spring semester (December and May).

Trainees will be required to audio/video tape clients for CAPS supervision and complete one Case Presentation in January.

We do not allow students to video/audio clients for class purposes.
